The Inaugural INTERPOL *World* 2015 Concludes on a High Note with Stronger Collaborative Tenacity to Foster Safer and Secure World

Singapore, 20 April 2015 – The inaugural INTERPOL *World* 2015 saw 7,807 government leaders, together with representatives of international organisations and researchers converge to discuss strategies to develop safer and more secure cities. A global platform to develop security solutions for the rapidly urbanising world, INTERPOL *World* concluded yesterday with potential and new partnerships forged and a stronger collective resolve to develop a more secure, resilient and safer cities for people around the world.

Held from 14 to 16 April, the INTERPOL *World* Expo, together with the INTERPOL *World* Theatre and demo area, had showcased the latest developments and technologies from 258 companies globally, while the INTERPOL *World* Congress closed on 16 April with 437 delegate exchanging ideas in the thought leadership dialogues and business meetings.

Note to Editor

The Congress component of INTERPOL *World* generated robust discussions among key expert speakers and industry captains on how the world can rise above prevailing security challenges and resource constraints, and benefit from the synergy of trans-border partnerships.

Key discussions at the Congress raised discussions on the roles of various mechanisms that support a dynamically secure environment and economy. These included –

At the congress on Border Management, IATA projected international travel to double by 2034. The panel had agreed that there is need to build a trusted community at national and international levels to ensure better border management controls. The world faces pertinent issues on this front – from terrorism to the increase of the discovery of firearms in passengers' luggage and the ever-present threat of stolen travel documents. While the experts agreed that technology does exist today to strengthen border management efforts, there are gaps that need to be closed to eliminate these threats altogether. These gaps include – ensuring enforcement officers are trained to use the information systems, ensuring these technological tools are used consistently, standardising identity authentication process and constant engagement in order for information exchange can be shared in a secured environment.

- CyberSecurity Congress highlighted that while technologies have advanced tremendously to combat cybercrimes, the underlying issue that was constantly raised during discussions was the need for closer PPP collaboration. The strength of such collaboration would bring companies, countries, law enforcement agencies closer together to fight cybercrime at a technical and policy levels, with quicker response time. Quick response time was a key point highlighted by the panel that emphasised speed is, very often, a critical factor when it comes to combating cybercrimes.
- In the Safe Cities Congress track, speakers agreed that as issues and challenges that cities face grow increasingly complex, no single entity can deal with the threats on their own. Governments and city officials must work with industry players and academia to form multiagency, multi-stakeholder partnerships in order to holistically manage the threats. In addition, speakers also emphasised the need for cities to embrace the use of technology and data analytics to build systems that can monitor across all city services, especially in critical infrastructure, to ensure the safety of cities.
 - At the **Supply Chain Security Congress**, key issues the world faces were discussed and summarised into four categories counterfeiting, falsifying of information, traceability and smuggling. The panel called for the use of various solutions from setting international standards, creating systems to understand the product history to authenticate goods traveling beyond borders and a stronger public, private and people partnership in order to secure our global supply chains.
